ON THE WAY FROM KOUŘÍM TO LIVORNO


1 MAY

After the tour we enjoyed a beautiful sunset at Terrazza Mascagni where we took a rest and then we had a delicious dinner at Porcavacca.





DIFFERENCES BETWEEN ITALIAN AND CZECH FAMILIES

Food






